

PLANT field guide

Grass-tree Xanthorrhoea sp.

When to look:

Year-round. Flowering occurs 2-3 times a year and following fire events in some species

Perennial treelike plant. Trunk resembles a tree above ground or exists under the earth's surface, is woody and made up of tiny packed leaves. Flowers borne as flower clusters on a cylindrical and spike-like woody axis.

> Phytophthora Root Rot causes death in this species

Help STOP the spread of Phytophthora - stay on the track and clean boots before and after entering bushland

Similar species:

Can be distinguished from Lomandras and other sedges by its fronds which are not flat (while sedges are) and don't grow in a fan-shape. Signs of poor health: mild to dominant yellowing of the foliage (note: some browning of foliage at the base of the grasstree is natural).
