

## Mount Grevillea *Grevillea victoriae*

### When to look:

Flowering usually occurs  
August - January

Erect, spreading shrub growing up to 3m high and 4.5m wide. Branchlets are covered in small, white hairs.



Fruits are smooth and cone-shaped that measure 17 - 20mm



Leaves are elliptical (oval-shaped), 6-12cm long and 10-45mm wide. Upper surface is olive green, smooth and shiny. Underside is pale green and covered in white hairs.

### Similar species:

Similar to *G. parvula* which is limited to the far east of Victoria and occurs in New South Wales.

*G. victoriae* at Mt Buffalo (*Grevillea victoriae* subsp. *victoriae*) is endemic to subalpine and alpine region of Victoria and occurs at altitudes between 1400-1900 metres

Flowers grow at the end of branches, are red, trumpet-shaped, and measure 3-17mm long. A single stem shoots from the centre of the flower, measuring up to 9cm.
