Pencil Pine Athrotaxis cupressoides

When to look:

Fresh female cones are visable in the summer

Conifer tree that typically has the classic conical shape and grows up to 15 m in height Male cones are 4-5 mm in diameter, female cones are 12-15 mm in diameter



Leaves are mid-dark green, 3-5 mm in length, and densely arranged around stems

Similar species:

King Billy pine (*Athrotaxis* selaginoides) has larger sharply-pointed leaves which are not tightly clasped to the stems. Hybrid pencil pine (*A. X* laxifolia) has foliage intermediate between King Billy pine and pencil pine, that is they are slightly spreading from the stem.
