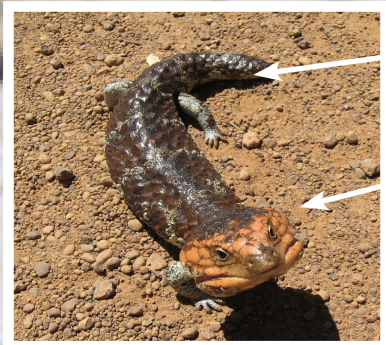


## Bobtail *Tiliqua rugosa*

### When to look:

*Sept to April, mating couples can be seen Sept to Nov, juveniles can be seen Dec to April*



Stumpy tail

Large triangular head

45 cm in length

The head is often lighter in colour and can have orange flecks on the top and sides

Irregular pale bands on the body and tail (usually absent on Northern subspecies)

Olive brown to black colouration

### Similar species:

There are no similar species to the Bobtail as it is one of the largest and most well-known skinks in Australia
