

## Frill-necked Lizard *Chlamydosaurus kingii*

When to look:

Sept to Mar, hatchlings  
emerge around Feb

70-95 cm in length,  
about two-thirds of  
length is tail



The frill around its  
neck ranges from  
yellow to black mixed  
with orange and red

### Similar species:

Common or Eastern  
Bearded Dragon (*Pogona  
barbata*): usually shorter  
than the Frill-necked  
Lizard, and doesn't have  
the large loose frill sitting  
around its neck (rather it  
has a throat membrane  
which it inflates if  
threatened). It is also only  
found in eastern Australia,  
excluding Cape York  
Peninsula and the cooler  
regions of the south-east.

Grey-brown to  
orange-brown body

Males have a  
black belly
