

PLANT field guide

Mountain Swamp Gum *Eucalyptus camphora* subsp. *humeana*

Similar species:

Closely resembles *E. camphora* subsp. *camphora*. This subspecies will usually have a petiole (stalk of a leaf) <20mm long, whereas subspecies *humeana* will have a petiole 20–30mm long.

Similar to *E. ovata*, which has wider buds & a more upright form.

Adult leaves: dull green, broad, elliptical (flat circle shape) to egg shaped, 8–15cm long, 2.5–6cm wide.



Adult leaf

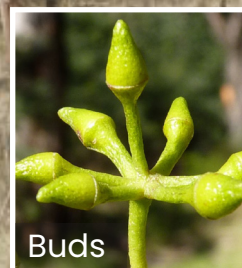
Straggly to erect tree, up to 20m height, rounded canopy. Smooth grey bark on top trunk, dark grey, scaly, shedding in ribbons on lower trunk.

Flowers are white inflorescence (flower clusters) 7-flowered.

Juvenile leaves: thick, egg-shaped to round, often notched on end, 7cm long.

Fruit

Fruit narrow, funnel-shaped, erect projecting valves, 0.6cm long & 0.6cm diameter.
